Team Activities for Diversity and Inclusion: #3. Walk in Someone Else's Shoes

"Perspective Talking", recommended by the Harvard Business Review is a great way to mentally walk in someone else's shoes. Lead your team through this activity with the following steps:

- 1. Prep your team with a background on different types of diversity
- 2. Remind your team members that individuals are welcome to share as much or as little about themselves as they feel comfortable with
- 3. Have your team share what types of diverse backgrounds are represented on their team (education, sexual orientation, race, etc.)
- 4. Pair each team member with a background that is different from their own
- 5. Have everyone write a few lines on the distinct challenges that they believe the background group they've been paired with could face
- 6. Share and discuss with the team or in small groups

This reflection will produce more empathic teams, and according to the Harvard study, will help build positive attitudes and behaviors toward minorities. The study also reveals increased support and "engaging in less mistreatment toward marginalized minorities."

Ruth Gates was a leading marine biologist and conservationist who studied coral reefs. Her work on creating "super corals" that are more resistant to climate change can be seen in the documentary Chasing Coral. She was an inspiration to LGBTQ+ scientists as an out lesbian at the top of her field.
